## Erase Cleaner #30-38

Consult your **ENVIROSAFE MANUFACTURING CORP.** Representative for the correct cleaning product to use for your particular application.

**Surface Preparation:** Surface should be dry before application of **Erase Cleaner** so as not to dilute the product unless dilution is desired.

**To Remove Floor Adhesives:** First remove carpet or linoleum and scrape off as much residue as possible with a floor scraper. Next, spray or roll on a copious amount of **Erase Cleaner** as it comes from the container. (Do NOT dilute **Erase** for this application) Immediately cover the area treated with a sheet of polyethylene plastic being sure to smooth out all air bubbles. Keep covered for 12-24 Hrs. With a razor scraper, scrape up as much adhesive as possible. (Dispose of adhesive in accordance with local laws.) Re-apply **Erase Cleaner** with either roller or sprayer and cover again to soften the last of the residue. Keep covered for 4-6 Hrs or until the residue is soft. Remove plastic and pressure wash to clean the surface. Thoroughly clean to remove ALL of the **Erase Cleaner** before attempting to apply any other coating.

**To Remove Wax:** Dilute **Erase Cleaner** with water at a 2:1 water to **Erase Cleaner** ratio and wash floor. Remove the rinse water with a wet vac or other means of removal. Thoroughly rinse.

**To Remove Ink:** Wear Rubber gloves and pour a small amount on a rag and clean area of ink. TEST on a small area first to be sure that paint or other finishes are not affected and to determine how long **Erase Cleaner** may be left on surface.

**To Clean Paint off Concrete:** Pour small amount of **Erase Cleaner** straight from container onto paint drops. Cover with a piece of polyethylene plastic and leave for several hours. Check to see if paint has softened. Using a wire brush, rub the spot until majority of paint is lifted. Repeat until all paint is removed from surface. Pressure wash thoroughly to remove residue from concrete.

**To Clean Vinyl Furniture and Vinyl Siding:** Dilute **Erase Cleaner** 4:1 with water (4 water to 1 **Erase**) Wear Rubber gloves so hands do not get dried out. Use a soft clean rag. Dip into solution and wipe surface using another rag to dry area. May be used on vinyl siding

**For General Cleaning:** Dilute **Erase Cleaner** 10 water to 1 **Erase**. Wear Rubber gloves to protect hands.

**DO NOT USE ERASE CLEANER ON ANY CAR FINISH: It may damage the finish.**
